E-ZPass has now joined the Virginia E-ZPass On-the-Go Retail Program. This program allows customers to obtain E-ZPass transponders at various retailers. Drivers receive prepaid E-ZPass transponders for use on all toll roads in Virginia and 14 other states.



The transponders are available for immediate use. Drivers pay \$35 with a \$15 toll credit. The additional \$20 is available for tolls when the transponder is registered online at www.EZPassVA.com or via telephone at 877-762-7824.

How Metro is Keeping You Safe

In the wake of the Boston Marathon explosions many commuters are thinking about their safety while riding DC Metro Transit. According to an article written by Martin Di Caro, of WAMU 88.5, a security expert says that the marathon bombings are not a reason to start worrying about your personal security in large crowds. Your odds of being killed in a terrorist attack as an American are slim to none.

Metro uses several different approaches to ensure your security. These approaches include K9 teams, specially trained officers on the Anti-Terror Team, random explosive screening of packages, sensors, cameras, and more. In addition, Metro also relies on observations by its employees and customers. Suspicious activity or unattended packages should be reported to Metro Transit Police at (202) 962-2121.

Safety Tips to Keep in Mind if Your Vehicle Breaks Down.

Each year millions of drivers experience some kind of problem on the road with their vehicles. Although each situation is unique below are some general guidelines you can follow if you find yourself in a disabled vehicle.



1. Note your vehicle's location. Make sure you are aware of your surroundings. Know where you are in relation to a major exit or cross street. This information is important if you must call for assistance.
2. Assess your vehicle's operating problem. Know what to do if you notice warning signs such as steering problems, smoke coming from under the hood, any unusual noises, or a flat tire.
3. If you have a flat tire signal, slow down, and pull onto the shoulder of the road.
4. If you run out of gas or if your engine stops, turn on your emergency flashers, carefully steer your vehicle out of traffic, and let its momentum get you off the road to a safe place. Avoid using your brakes until necessary.
5. If you must pull off the road don't stand behind or directly in front of your vehicle.
6. If you are unable to pull off the road turn on your emergency flashers. Do not risk pushing your vehicle to a safe location. If you are at risk of being struck from behind do not stay with your vehicle.

7. Alert other motorists by turning on your emergency lights, raising your hood, tying a brightly colored handkerchief or scarf on your car, and placing flares or warning triangles to direct oncoming traffic away from your vehicle.
8. Communicate your situation. Once you are in a safe location, you can notify others of your vehicle breakdown. Make note of your surroundings.
9. Remain with your vehicle. Under most circumstances if you are able to pull away from traffic, it is safest to remain in your vehicle until a law enforcement officer or other help arrives.
10. If you must exit the vehicle, do so safely and well away from oncoming traffic. You should exit through the side of the vehicle facing away from the road.
