Securing Your Parked Vehicle

Last month an email was circulated concerning a vehicle robbery that took place in a parking garage in DC. Based off of the information in this email we felt it is important to remind you of some important tips to consider when securing your vehicle while you are at work. Remember car thieves typically look for easy targets. By implementing some important habits you can decrease your chances of becoming a victim.

1. Lock your vehicle, windows, remove any "hidden" spare keys, and take your keys with you.
2. Remove your garage door opener. If you have a GPS never have your home address loaded into it's memory. Coupled with your home address and garage door opener you become an even easier target for a home burglary.

3. Don't leave personal property such as laptops, wallets, expensive sun glasses, cells phones, etc... in your vehicle. Instead if you must leave them lock them in the vehicles trunk out of plain sight.
4. Turn your wheels sharply and apply the emergency brake when parking to deter unauthorized towing.
5. Invest in audible and visual warning devices such as alarms, steering wheel locks, brake locks or wheel locks, theft-deterrent decals, and window etching.

K&K Safety Corner Do You Know What to Do If You Have a Tire Blowout?

Having an unexpected flat tire or tire blowout can be a bit unnerving especially if you are traveling on the interstate at high speeds. Below are some important tips to remember if you find yourself in this situation:

1. At the first sign of tire trouble, grip the steering wheel firmly.

2. Don't slam on the brakes.
3. Let the car slow down gradually by taking your foot off the gas pedal.
4. Work your vehicle toward the breakdown lane or, if possible, toward an exit.
5. Steer as your vehicle slows down. It is better to roll the car off the roadway (when you have slowed to 30 miles per hour) and into a safe place than it is to stop in traffic and risk a rear-end or side collision from other vehicles.
6. When all four wheels are off the pavement—brake lightly and cautiously until you stop.
7. Turn your emergency flashers on.
8. It's important to have the car well off the pavement and away from traffic before stopping, even if proceeding to a place of safety means rolling along slowly with the bad tire flapping. You can drive on a flat if you take it easy and avoid sudden moves
9. Raise your hood and tie something white to the radio antenna or hang it out a window so police officers or tow truck operators will know that you need help.
10. Don't stand behind or next to your vehicle. If possible, stand away from the vehicle and wait for help to arrive.
11. Tackle changing a tire only if you can do so without placing yourself in danger.
